Research Participant Recruitment

These interviews are designed to address specific questions while allowing the participants to provide additional information and perspectives voluntarily. In this stage of the research study, we seek to explore the social condition of Veterans and survivors of Veterans from multiple viewpoints. This project is funded by the Canadian Institute for Military Veteran Health Research.

Changes to the CPO/CWO Rank

COMMENTS

All CPO1s and CWOs in the CAF are now under the CPO1/CWO Corps and our collective MOSID is 00381. Within the CWO Corps, there are 6 different levels (or sub-MOSIDS) as you see below:

TIER 4 – Unit RSMs Tactical Level Tier (TLT) (00381-05) (CWO Rank – Trade Hat badge)

TIER 4+ - Key Appointment Tactical Post-Unit Level Tier (TPULT) (00381-04) (CWO Rank – Tri-service Hat badge)

TIER 3 – Base/Bde SM Post Tactical Level Tier (PTLT) (00381-03) (Senior Appointment CWO Rank – Tri-service Hat badge)

TIER 2 – Area/Division SM Master Post Tactical Level Tier (MPTLT) (00381-03) (Senior Appointment CWO Rank – Tri-service Hat badge) SEE NOTES BELOW

TIER 1 – Level 1 CWOs Strategic Level Tier (SLT) (00381-02) (Command CWO Rank – Tri-service Hat badge)

TIER 0 – CAF CWO (00381-01) (CAF CWO Rank – Tri-service Hat badge)

There are only approx. 445 (article reports 449) Reg Force CWO posns they are broken down as follows:

Total # of Unit RSMs (TLT) = 309

Total # of Key posns TPULT = 53

Total # of PTLT = 74

Total # of SLT = 8 Command CWOs + 1 CAF CWO

NOTE: The Tier 2 Level CWOs (Division SMs) are supposed to be called MPTLT in the very near future, our MOSID # will be changing and apparently a new CWO Rank will be developed to differentiate from Base/Brigade SM but I'm not sure when it will take effect. As well, TIER 2-0 CWOs have to wear the big forge caps like the General Offrs when wearing DEUs with medals (some exceptions).

Here are some bullet points that may clarify a few things:

1. Part of the Strategic Employment Model (SEM) was to identify all the CPO1/CWO positions in the CAF and define their roles and responsibilities. Those CWO posns that were determined not to be leadership posns (part of a command team) but rather more technical in nature were downgraded or are in the process of all being downgraded to CPO2/MWO. The SEM Project, amongst other things, identified training and experience shortfalls that are required to function at the most senior levels within the CAF.

2. In short, as soon as a CPO2/MWO gets promoted to CPO1/CWO, his/her MOSID changes from his previous trade to the CWO Corps MOSID (00381). As a Tier 4 RSM, you start at the lowest level of CWO (00381-05). Your MOSID changes but you still keep your Trade Hat Badge.

3. After your typical 3-year term as an RSM, a CWO will not be asked to do a second term as an RSM. In other words, you only get "one kick at the can" as a TIER 4 CWO. With luck (and timing), a unit RSM will be asked to do a TIER 4+ job (Key Posn) or even be offered a TIER 3 (Senior Appt). Even though they will not be any lateral moves in the future, there are however "off ramps" so a CWO can seek PD opportunities (Second Language Trg, overseas tours, year-long training in Canada and abroad) to get ready for the next job.

4. If there are no more job offers, a CWO may be offered to become a Capt through the Special Requirements Commissioning Plan (SRCP). SRCP is similar to CFR for MWOs except CWOs are guaranteed not to move for 5 years (???) and do not have to do any officer training (OPME, etc...). After a CWO does at least one job as a TIER 3 CWO, you may be offered to SRCP directly to Maj as long as you meet the pre-reqs. If you reach the CAF CWO posn and still have enough time left to serve, a CAF CWO may be asked to SRCP directly to LCol as long as you meet the pre-reqs.

Like the article says, the CPO1/CWO rank only represents approx. 0.7 % of the total NCM numbers and only approx. 25% (1 in 4) CWOs will be asked to perform a second term in a key or senior appointment. This new system will likely ensure that the CWO rank does not become stagnant in the future and that only the top CWOs in the CAF will be asked to serve in higher CWO Posns after their time as a unit RSM. I hope this lengthy E-Mail answers most of your questions, my apologies for being so wordy..... Let me know if you have any other questions.

Death Benefit

If your spouse dies while in service, you will have many things to worry about, money is one we can help with right away. The Death Benefit is paid to a spouse or common-law partner and the dependent children of a Canadian Armed Forces member who died as a result of a service-related injury or illness.

About this program

When military families lose a loved one as a result of a sudden service-related death, there can be great suffering as the surviving spouse and children struggle to find their place in the civilian world.

Veterans Affairs Canada pays a death benefit to help ease that struggle.

The [amount of this benefit](#) is adjusted annually according to the cost of living.

Do you qualify?

The Death Benefit is paid to a spouse or common-law partner and dependent children if a Canadian Armed Forces member has died as a result of a service-related injury or disease provided the death occurred within 30 days after the injury occurred or the disease was contracted. If the death was more than 30 days after the incident, this support is provided through Disability benefits.

You should apply for the Death Benefit if you are the survivor or dependant of a deceased CAF Veteran.

A survivor is defined as:

- the surviving spouse, who was, at the time of the member's death, residing with the member, or
- the person who was, at the time of the Canadian Armed Forces member's death, the member's common-law partner (a common-law partner means a person who is cohabiting with the member in a conjugal relationship, having so co-habited for a period of at least one year).

A dependent child is defined as:

- the child of a Canadian Armed Forces member (or of their spouse or common-law partner) who is under 18 years of age, or
 - under 25 years of age and attending school, or an adult but physically or mentally incapacitated and prevented from earning a living. In addition, the child must have been living in the home of the Canadian Armed Forces member to be considered a dependent child.

How to apply

When a Canadian Armed Forces member dies in service, VAC is usually notified by the military and we will contact you.

If you have not heard from us at the time of the member's death, please [contact us](#). There is an application form for this benefit, but we can help you complete that form.

Apply online

If you are registered for My VAC Account, you can submit your application for this benefit online. If you aren't registered, you can [register now](#).

Mail or in person

Download the application form. Then, drop it off at a [VAC office or CAF Transition Centre](#). You can also mail your completed application directly to the address listed on the form.

Frequently asked questions

Is the Death Benefit supposed to function as a form of life insurance?

The death benefit is not designed to be life insurance. Instead, it recognizes the impact the death of a service member has on the functioning of their immediate family, including the permanent loss of guidance, care and companionship. It is paid in addition to the usual pension-related death benefits under the [Canada Pension Plan](#) and the [Canadian Forces Superannuation Act](#).

If I apply for the benefit and get declined, can I appeal?
